Psychology 200 and 201 plus open option courses

Students may apply for admission in either year one or year three. During years one and two, students establish foundation skills in Community Rehabilitation and Disability Studies, and begin a program of study in another discipline i.e. Communication and Culture, Humanities, Social Work.
